Photographs of Sinkler family of Eutawville, S.C. include daguerreotypes of William Henry Sinkler I, ambrotypes of William Henry Sinkler II, ambrotype of Isaac Porcher, and a ninth plate case with albumen print of William Henry Sinkler II in uniform; photographs of interest are interior of Eutawville Chapel in 1909 and Sinkler family on porch of Eutaw Plantation; album begun by Cleremonde Serre Gaillard in 1866 and contains cartes-de-visite of family and friends and some Civil War notables such as General Beauregard; other album belonged to Anna L. Sinkler, 1882, and contains only a few cartes-de-visite and tintypes of family and friends, including Etta Gaillard, Esther Gaillard, and Yates Snowden in military school uniform.

This is part of a letter Margaret Cantey Sinkler, in Charleston, wrote to her son William Sinkler 10 February 1802 [probably] while he was in school in Newport, RI: "I should certainly my William have no objection to sending you the whole of your fifty dollars but I have sat for my picture to Mr. Malbone of Newport; I thought as he is reckoned to take extraordinary likenesses you would have no objection to spend your fifty dollars for my miniature – You may say – Why not give it to me Mama? I tell you why! Since your Father's death I never have called Sixpence of money out of the hands of the executors – The money which is now there is intestate & I hope may be given my little James, nor has any one a right to touch it until the Court decides whose it shall be – that cannot take place afore [April?] – This last years crop – which I have a third of – there is not a bail of cotton nor barrel of rice yet sold, so you see my Son, it is the want of the ability & not Inclination – that I do not send it to you. Mr. Malbone speaks of going to Newport & I will give the Miniature to him to deliver you – & will get Mr. Richardson to supply you with pocket money –"]
