Biographical Note:

James Douglas Mauldin was a native of Oconee County, South Carolina. He attended school in Seneca and was a graduate of Furman University. He served in the United States Army, stationed in the South Pacific, before returning to South Carolina and beginning his career as a journalist and photographer. He worked for the *Greenville News*, *The State*, the *Rock Hill Herald*, and the Associated Press, frequently reporting on government affairs in South Carolina.



Mauldin passed away in 2007. After his death, Russ McKinney, formerly press secretary to Governor Dick Riley, told *The State*, "Doug was just a real unique individual. He was a fixture at the State House for a number of years....He was a stickler for accuracy and clarity when it came to his reporting."

Scope and Content Note:

The collection mainly consists of photographic prints of public figures taken by Mauldin during his years as a political reporter. Most of the identifying information was provided by Mr. Mauldin on the reverse of the photos.
